Discussion of how to share portions of the letter with one another. Recommendation

Members who intend to make motions can email them to Riley before the 21st Discussion of law enforcement tows, which were previously considered as nonconsensual tows, as per the new legislation the task force was not asked to make any report on the pricing of law enforcement.

Motion made by Ruscha “That Task Force make recommendations on each fee category associated with non-consensual tows as part of its report.” Motion seconded by Chiriboga-Flor.

Clarification asked from TTF members of the intention and reasoning for the motion. Requirements of the response were discussed broadly, do recommendations need to offer specific amounts or percentage, or can the recommendation be more broad, such as research a specific category or fee.

Four votes yes, 5 votes no. The motion does not pass.
